EXPLORATIONS IN PSYCHIC GEOGRAPHY

The first in a series of group shows at the Or exploring tangents associated with Psychic Geography. Stemming from the Situationist Internationale (SI) term psychogeography, Psychic Geography deals with leisure economies, distraction, collaboration, fantasy, and the spiritualization of civilization, all while holding possible utopias at arm's length. Psychic Geography departs from the SI's original intent by freeing the geography from a locus. While still remaining locked to spatial relations, it is a cognitive geography, testing the principles of pychogeography within the gallery space.

By using New Wave tropes well past their peak, Jacques Rivette's film Celine and Julie Go Boating draws on the study of psychology and magic to illustrate the possible journeys of the mind. The three exhibiting artists have been given a cut-up segment of this film as a basis for response.

Psychic Geography as mapping of an immaterial, infinite space – the mind. This is a realm without reference, without horizon, where scale has no meaning. How do we explain terrain? Architecture is a structuring form that delineates exterior from interior. In the film Celine and Julie go Boating the characters discover a conduit that allows them to move through a corporeal architecture into each other's minds. Generally people use the symbolic (words, facial patterns, pictures) to enable them to express their mental terrain. Unable to display the material landscape, Tony and I have paraphrased its constructions and denotations through symbolic architectures.

Corin Sworn is an active Vancouver artist, writer, and curator. Sworn has exhibited extensively both locally and internationally and is represented by the VTO Gallery in London.

Jason Breeden's Corporate Fatalism

Jason Breeden's suite of Corporate Fatalism manifests itself in three parts.

The first is a drawing Manifesto, a series of doodle-like play-scapes comprised of elements of utopian architecture, once someone has jumped of the imaginary balcony (a phone rings?)

Breeden posits drawing or the exhibition of drawings or framed work, the compiling of squares, as being a possibly self-indulgent revolutionary act that annihilates itself in order to exist as an action.

The second are superfluous documents of freedom; the astrological chart of a 300 year old golden spruce tree, cut down by "eco-terrorist" Grant Hadwin in Port Clements, B.C. In order for the chart to be constructed by astrologer Jeff Chute, a specific birth date had to be selected. Breeden chose January 20th 1692, the day Elizabeth Parris and Abigail Williams began showing symptoms of wyrding ways; the day that eventually led to the Salem Witch trials. The remaining documents are evidences of star ownership and it coordinates in "the heavens".

Breeden's video piece, projected on the concrete wall in the gallery office, bridges a Board Room and a dinner party with curator and artists reciting his script.

What is corporate fatalism? Is it, in the end, the complete discounting of pure action? And is pure action the founding moment of a revolutionary act?

Breeden's marginal escape in into the doodle, or into escapism itself:

"As famous as anything standing over a river canyon-by this I mean to see how long it takes to make"

Jason, it's three in the morning-where are you?

I'm in San Fransisco-

I thought you were going tot New York-yeah well, I drove here- I rented a car-

What are you doing?

I bought a star-that cut-up was like 13 seconds long-

You bought a star-How? I know, I told you it was short

I was driving through the desert; I thought I would buy a star. There's like barely a point to it

I didn't know one was able to buy a star. I know-it's more of a placebo

So, where is it?

I don't' know exactly, well actually I do, they are sending me a chart, but it will be in New Mexico, so I can't tell you now-

Do you have to pay property taxes?

Well probably, but it's mine anyhow-I named it

Oh god, what did you name it?

Well, I don't know why I named it that, it just came to me-
